21 Seiki-sakura **Matsuri Festival**




















Please Follow the Waste Disposal Rules

Have you ever been confused about how to sort the resources and waste coming out of your home every day?

Below are some examples of waste sorting that is often done incorrectly.

1) Bulky waste

In general, an item measuring 30 centimeters or more on its side is bulky waste. It is still bulky waste even if you break it up and put it in a bag.

2) Differences in material

The disposal method changes depending on the item's materials and the percentages of those materials. Use the disposal method for the material that comprises the largest part of the item.

Ota City distributes a pamphlet titled "How to dispose and separate your waste and recyclable waste" (available in six languages: English, Chinese, Korean, Tagalog, Nepali, and Vietnamese). Please refer to it if you have questions about the sorting and disposal of items not mentioned above.

Regular Group Rabies Vaccinations for 2025

Dog owners are required by law to have their dog vaccinated against rabies once a year and to attach the vaccination certificate issued by the City to their dogs. In Ota City, ribbons are used as vaccination certificates.

The City holds Regular Group Rabies Vaccinations where owners can vaccinate their dogs against rabies and receive vaccination certificates on the spot.

Ribbons used as vaccination certificates



- 10 days from Saturday, April 12 to Monday, April 21, 2025
- City-designated veterinary hospitals in Ota City (designated veterinary hospitals: visit Ota City's website for details.)
- 3,750 yen
 Breakdown: Rabies vaccination fee: 3,200 yen
 Vaccination tag issuance fee: 550 yen
- Eligibility Dog owners in Ota City
- Bring your dog to a designated veterinary hospital during the program period.
- Application is not required.


Ota City is recruiting "Cool OTA-KU ambassadors" to publicize Ota City and its attractions.





















Making Bikes More Convenient and Safe!

Ota City Community Cycle Program



Ota City Community Cycle is a fee-based bicycle sharing service. You can borrow and return a bike at any of the numerous docomo Bike Share cycle ports (bike stations) located in Tokyo. There are about 150 cycle ports within Ota City alone.

Locking Your Bicycle

In Ota City, local ordinances require bicycle owners to take antitheft measures such as locking their bicycles. To prevent theft of your bicycle, always lock your bicycle, even if you are parking it at your home or only leaving it temporarily in a bicycle parking lot. Using two locks is even better, as it forces the thief to work longer. Protect your bicycle by using two locks.



Bicycle Street Markings and Lines



- Ota City has painted markings and lines on streets in the city to guide bicycles.
- The markings and lines are positioned on the left side of the roadway to indicate where bicycles are supposed to ride.
- Ride in the direction indicated by the arrows while yielding to each other.
- At intersections without traffic lights, obey traffic rules and manners, such as stopping and making sure the way is safe by looking left and right.
- Pass vehicles parked on the street only after checking that it is safe behind them.
