
















What is the Children's Study Support Class?

Applying for an Exemption from National Pension Insurance Premiums

Do you have difficulty paying your National Pension Insurance premiums? Ota City has an exemption scheme that can help.

You must have a personal identification document, Basic Pension Number Notice, and other documents to apply. After you apply for the scheme, the Japan Pension Service Branch Office will assess the income that you (the applicant), your spouse, and your head of household received in the previous year.

If your application is approved, you will be exempted from paying all or part of your National Pension Insurance premiums. Applications may be made retroactively for premiums owed up to two years and one month in the past. A new application must be submitted each year.

About the census

The National Census will be conducted nationwide with a census date of October 1, 2025. The census will cover everyone residing in Japan, regardless of age or nationality. The results will provide basic data for addressing important issues faced by national and local governments. We hope for your cooperation with the census.

Census method and schedule

Census forms will start being distributed by enumerators in early September 2025.

Please submit your response online or using the distributed census form (a return envelope will be enclosed).

The census response period will be from Saturday, September 20, to Wednesday, October 8, 2025.
